Board Approved: September 1, 2016

Application for Free and Reduced Price Meals

All families are encouraged to submit an application for free and reduced meals by the Friday of the first week of school. Families can at any time submit a new application if there is a change in the household income or family number. Applications can be accessed in the Main Office.

Meal Charge Policy

iLEAD allows students to charge meals in the cafeteria, and expects families to pay their cafeteria fees on a weekly or monthly basis. Invoices will be sent home each month with the student's balance. Families are expected to provide money for student meals on a regular and consistent basis, unless they qualify for free meals.

Student Pricing

- Students who do not qualify for free or reduced price meals must pay \$1.50 for breakfast and \$2.50 for lunch
- Students who qualify for reduced meals must pay \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch

Payment Options

- Parents are encouraged to make payments in advance at the office, and will receive a monthly invoice
- Students or parents may pay cash or check for meals at the front office.
