

Graduation Requirements



iLEAD Online High School Diploma Graduation Requirements

The term “regular high school diploma” is defined as a diploma fully aligned to grade-level standards. Students typically complete mandated academic courses to receive a standard high school diploma. California Education Code 51225.3 defines the mandated high school courses needed to earn a regular high school diploma. iLEAD Online has chosen to provide differentiated diploma options. These alternatives not only address the mandated high school courses needed to earn a regular high school diploma, but also offer a diploma based on A-G requirements that provide greater access to college and exceed the state’s minimum requirements.

Graduation Requirement Exemptions

Under Education Code 51225.1, the following learners may be exempted from iLEAD Online's graduation requirements under specific circumstances:

Foster Youth
Homeless Youth
Former Juvenile Court Youth
Children of Military Families
Migrant Youth
Newcomer Youth

Should a learner in one of the above groups meet the requirements under EC 51225.1, school counselor will work with the learners who will either choose to:

Complete a 5th year at iLEAD Online in order to meet iLEAD Online's diploma requirements, OR
Complete the iLEAD Online's Career Ready Graduation Requirements, which is equivalent to the California Minimum Graduation Requirements.

iLEAD Online shall ensure a learner who meets the criteria under EC 51225.1, shall be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and any school activity related to graduation in which a graduating learner of a similar age would be eligible to participate.

In addition, the school Director or designee shall have authority to grant exemptions from local graduation requirements in accordance with law and Board policy. Individual exemption determinations shall not require separate Board approval. A learner is permitted to graduate upon completion of the California state minimum graduation requirements when: the learner has experienced significant, documented unforeseen circumstances beyond the learner's control (e.g., severe medical condition, family crisis, displacement, or other hardship), and the learner has made a good faith effort to meet district graduation requirements, and completion of additional district requirements is not reasonably possible within the learner's four-year high school timeline. Any such determination shall be made on a case-by-case basis and shall not establish precedent.



College Ready Graduation Requirements

iLEAD Online requires a total of 220 credits in the following areas for a UC a-g aligned diploma. Typically, learners earn five (5) credits for each course in which they receive a semester grade of "D" or better.

Career Ready Graduation Requirements



California Education Code (EC) Section 51225.3 has specified a minimum set of courses to meet state requirements to graduate from high school and receive a diploma. The governing boards of local education agencies (LEAs) have the authority to supplement the state minimum requirements at the local level. iLEAD Online requires a total of 180 credits in the following areas for a standard diploma. Typically, learners earn five (5) credits for each course in which they receive a semester grade of "D" or better.
