# AB 361 Emergency Legislation Regarding Brown Act Meeting Requirements Board Approved:

Whereas, the Governor signed an Executive Order Suspending the Brown Act until October 1, 2021,

Whereas, the Governor signed Emergency Legislation AB 361 in September 2021,

Whereas, according to AB 361, the public charter school Board may take advantage of additional flexibility in teleconference meetings so long as the school complies with the following:

- The public has access via internet and/or telephone to the Board meeting and can provide public comment in some electronic form,
- The charter school uses it sound discretion and makes reasonable efforts to adhere, as closely as possible, to the other provisions of the Brown Act in order to maximize transparency and provide public access.

# Whereas, AB 361 states that:

• If there is a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor, the same suspension of teleconferencing rules apply, if either state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing or, by Board vote a finding imminent risk to health or safety of attendees.

# Whereas, SB 361 requires:

- The Board must provide means of how public comment will be available (internet/by phone);
- If a technical disruption occurs, no action can be taken; and
- No early requirement for public comment will be set into place and the Board shall allow for "real time" comments during full public comment period; and
- The Board makes a finding every 30 days to continue teleconferencing.

Therefore, based on the Board's 30-day reconsideration of the current circumstances of the State of Emergency and situations of the State of Emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person, and/or the State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing;

The Board has determined that it will hold its next meeting in a hybrid mode allowing Board Members and the public to attend the meetings in person using social distancing requirements or virtually given individual needs and choice of the attendee.

Building Relationships Between School Staff and Families:

Agua Dulce builds relationships and community with intentionality. Agua Dulce provides many hands-on activities and events that promote learner and family engagement. This includes play-based learning, farm animals, PBL projects, Presentations of Learning, Learner-led Conferences, Individualized Learning Plans co-created with facilitators, learners and families as well as aerospace opportunities. The results of these endeavors is positive student engagement and school climate, as confirmed by our Educational Partner Survey results indicating strong favorable responses for our Teacher-Student Relationships and School Climate.

iLEAD Agua Dulce will generate active engagement between parents, families, and the school as well as connections with the community, to promote learner achievement and communication among all educational partners as defined in our LCAP Goal #3. This goal addresses the need for a strategic focus on learner well-being and family engagement in school activities. The charter school will continue to strengthen, support and expand opportunities for learners to understand how to succeed academically and social-emotionally, develop supportive relationships, foster a positive school culture, and increase school engagement. A renewed emphasis will also be placed on family involvement and parent education to increase learner and family connectedness in a safe,

supportive, and stable learning environment.

Based on our analysis of the Panorama Educational Partner input and local data, the LEA plans to improve engagement of underrepresented families in relation to Building Relationships Between School Staff and Families in the following ways: Educational Partner meetings, Family Education opportunities such as the Special Education Student Symposium, and Parent University webinars or in-person meetings to promote engagement.

iLEAD Agua Dulce will continue to incorporate multiple ways for families to engage, connect with the community through volunteer and outreach strategies, and provide communication amongst all educational partners to promote learner engagement and awareness of the mission and vision of iLEAD Agua Dulce. The school will conduct an annual survey for input on the school and its programs to determine our strengths and areas of growth.

iLEAD Agua Dulce will provide ongoing family education and additional resources (through counseling support, community partnerships and/or additional resources based on individual need) and will be dedicated to support all learners through the guidance of school counselors, liaisons and coordinators. Underrepresented families and those with unduplicated learners are often less connected to school and sometimes need additional support on how to support their learners in the home typically resulting in higher rates of chronic absenteeism and lower araduation rates

Building Partnerships for Student Outcomes:

iLEAD Agua Dulce has conducted surveys and analyzed data from our educational partners, as well as state and local assessments to determine our current strengths and progress in Building Partnerships for Student Outcomes. will provide all learners with a rigorous, creative, and broad curriculum to maximize academic achievement and college/career readiness, as defined in our LCAP Goal #2.

iLEAD Agua Dulce LCAP Goal #2 emphasizes a continued focus on student achievement across all student groups to include increased ELA and math achievement on both state assessments and NWEA MAP (a California Department of Education (CDE)-approved, internal diagnostic assessment). The goal is to prepare learners academically and social-emotionally through project-based learning and/or personalized learning opportunities that align with state standards. Learner and credentialed teacher (facilitator) feedback on the iLEAD Comprehensive Growth Card, a measure on social-emotional, academic and personal goal-setting, also indicate a need for growth in academic achievement. Additionally, there is a need to concentrate efforts on the percentage of high schoolers graduating as prepared as indicated on the California School Dashboard's College/Career indicator.

During the 2021-22 school year, iLEAD Agua Dulce's high school began with a freshman class of learners. School staff is working to ensure learner voice and choice and that all courses being offered are A-G. Both middle schoolers and high schoolers utilize CPM curriculum which is rigorous and PBL-based. The school will continue to develop its high school program so that learners graduate college and career ready as measured by the CA School Dashboard. The school continues to monitor student achievement across student groups.

After a careful analysis of our educational partner input, as well as state and local data, iLEAD Agua Dulce will continue to work on improving engagement of underrepresented families and learners in relation to Priority 3: Building Partnerships for Student Outcomes. School staff will support and track all learners, including Special Education, Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, Foster/Homeless, etc.) in their mastery of standards through integrated core projects and curriculum as reflected on state assessments and other internal measures. School staff will work to ensure there is a high percentage of all learners who participate in internal and state assessments.

The EL Coordinator and other school staff will utilize professional development principles in ELD and regularly analyze data to provide targeted support with a focus on increased English proficiency in reading, listening, speaking, and writing to ensure progress is being made towards reclassification.

Through a variety of strategies including professional development sessions, learner-led conferences and/or learning period meetings, school staff will work with learners to create goals and action plans to improve academic performance and social-emotional learning (SEL). Additionally, school staff will provide SEL strategies to support learners in achieving their personal goals.

The school plans to monitor these identified student groups both academically and social-emotionally in order to provide additional, targeted support to promote learner achievement and college and career readiness. As iLEAD Agua Dulce's new high school program evolves, the school will also increase counseling, monitoring and support to ensure unduplicated are utilizing opportunities and coursework in order to graduate prepared as indicated on the CA School Dashboard.

Seeking Input for Decision Making:

iLEAD Agua Dulce is committed to the meaningful engagement of its educational partners and regularly seeks input in the decision-making process. For example, we cultivate their feedback in the development of the LCAP. For the annual update, feedback from families, learners, community members, board members, learners, and iLEAD Agua Dulce staff and leadership was utilized to evaluate program effectiveness and address the state priorities. Upon careful examination of the input received, action steps under iLEAD Agua Dulce's three existing goals were maintained, expanded or modified to further learner achievement and continue the development of program offerings.

During the 2021-22 school year, monthly iSUPPORT meetings were held to allow opportunity for school staff and families to connect regarding the school program. Informal feedback was also received by families through family involvement at schoolwide events. Additionally, monthly EL collaborations with the EL coordinators across iLEAD Schools provided the opportunity for sharing ideas gathered from facilitator and family feedback on how to improve the English learner program.

The WASC substantive change visit (to add a grade level) occurred in the fall of 2021. Feedback from that visit included preparing future graduates to graduate as college and career prepared through the coursework and opportunities provided by iLEAD Agua Dulce.

Twice a year, iLEAD Agua Dulce learners and staff completed the iLEAD Comprehensive Growth Card, a measure of learner growth in the Schoolwide Learner Outcomes, as well as their progress towards academic and social-emotional goals. Additionally, staff and leadership meetings were held monthly to discuss the program, learner progress, and gather/reflect on suggestions for improvements. Parent and learner surveys regarding aspects of the program were sent in the spring of 2022 to solicit feedback. These surveys addressed specific aspects of the LCAP (the eight state priorities for the creation of potential action steps).

Additionally, in the spring of 2022, iLEAD Schools' Equity Task Force also conducted listening sessions and/or facilitated surveys of staff, leadership and learners. Monthly board meetings were held virtually and in-person with the opportunity for anyone from the public to attend (including staff, parents and learners). On June 22, 2022, a public hearing was held for additional feedback before the LCAP was board approved on June 29, 2022.

When developing each action for iLEAD Agua Dulce, the needs of all learners were considered by looking at the NWEA MAP results, SST, and attendance data by sub-populations. Stakeholder feedback regarding safety, school events, diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) were also considered to develop a well-rounded plan that ensured the needs of all learners were being met. The actions developed are important for all learners, especially foster youth, English learners and low-incomestudents. The action steps include growth for educators (professional development in MTSS, best practices and all students to monitor academic, social-emotional and school offerings for all sub-populations. It is a comprehensive plan that considers the data from many angles including stakeholder feedback, parent meetings, academic, SST, and social-emotional data.

iLEAD Agua Dulce assigned a family liaison to support foster youth, English learners and low-income students with community resources, school-wide resources and regular check-ins for any specific social-emotional or academic needs. Additionally, the school plans to open a Wellness Center and utilize MTSS to support learners. Academic provisions such as additional tutoring and after school workshops will be provided to support academic growth in English Learners, Foster Youth and Low Income Learners

iLEAD Aqua Dulce believes that both academic and social-emotional skills are critical to school, career, and life success. We use a custom Panorama Student Survey to help measure and support our learners' perceptions of school climate, school safety, engagement, belonging, and facilitator-learner relationships. In Spring 2022, 160 learners in grades 3rd-9th took the nationally-normed Panorama Study Survey, with the following results:

School Belonging

How much learners feel that they are valued members of the school community.

65% Favorable Responses in 3-5

32% Favorable Responses in 6-9

80% of learners in 3rd-5th felt that they receive a great deal of support from the adults at their school. 67% believe that the people at their school understand them as individuals. 62% felt that they belong at their school.

35% of learners in 6th-9th felt connected to the adults at their school, while 30% report that the people at their school understand them as individuals. 41% of the 6th-9th learners felt a sense of belonging at their school.

#### School Climate

Student perceptions of the overall social and learning climate of the school.

71% Favorable Responses in 3-5 62% Favorable Responses in 6-9

80% of the 3rd-5th learners felt that the rules at the school are fair, while 78% believe that their facilitators are excited to be teaching their class. 72% also felt that the energy of the school is positive.

70% of the learners in grades 6-9 report that the physical learning environment at their school was quite pleasant. More than half (62%) said the energy of the school was quite positive. 72% felt that the rules at the school were fair, while 71% felt their facilitators were excited to be teaching their classes.

School Engagement

How attentive and invested learners are in school. 55% Favorable Responses Overall in Grades 3-5

36% Favorable Responses Overall in Grades 6-8

60% of the learners in grades 3-5 were excited to go to school each day and 62% were very focused on the activities in their classrooms. 66% expressed a high level of interest in their classes, while 49% were excited to participate in the learning activities.

In 6th-9th grade, 37% of the learners felt excited about going to their classes, and 36% were eager to participate in the learning activities. 48% felt quite interested in their classes.

School Safety Perceptions of learner physical and psychological safety at school.

63% Favorable Responses Overall in Grades 3-5 68% Favorable Responses Overall in Grades 6-8

The majority of 3rd-5th learners (79%) report that it is highly unlikely that someone from school would bully them online. 82% said it is quite unlikely for learners to get into physical fights at school. 53% hardly ever worry about violence at school.

66% of 6th-9th grade learners report that it would be quite easy to get help from an adult if they were bullied at school, and most (68%) would find it unlikely to be bullied from another student online. 71% do not worry about violence occurring at their school. 82% felt that the adults treat them quite fairly. The vast majority (86%) report that there are little to no physical fights at school.

#### School Teacher-Student Relationships

How strong the social connection is between facilitators and learners within and beyond the school.

82% Favorable Responses Overall in Grades 3-5 58% Favorable Responses Overall in Grades 6-8

90% of the learners in grades 3-5 believe that their facilitators are highly respectful towards the learners. 74% report that their facilitators would be very concerned and caring if they walked into school upset. 82% of the learners would be excited to have their same teachers again.

78% of learners in grade 6-9 believe that their facilitators are respectful toward learners at school. They felt (61%) that the teachers are caring and concerned when they come to school or class upset. 56% would be excited to have their same facilitators again in the future.

# Acceleration and Retention Policy Board Approved: May 11, 2021

The Governing Board expects learners to progress through each grade level within one school year. To accomplish this, instruction should accommodate the variety of ways that learners learn and include strategies for addressing academic deficiencies when needed.

Learners shall progress through the grade levels by demonstrating growth in learning and meeting grade level standards of expected learner achievement.

Learners shall be identified for acceleration or retention based on the following data:

- CAASPP scores
- NWEA MAP assessments
- Other summative and formative assessments in ELA, writing, and mathematics
- Grades
- Facilitator observations/feedback
- Any other relevant data in the Student Study Team (SST) process

#### **Acceleration**

Acceleration is possible when high academic achievement is evident. However, the learner's social and emotional growth shall be taken into consideration before placing them in a higher grade. The School Director or designee may recommend a learner for acceleration into a higher grade level upon review of the Student Study Team's (SST) findings.

#### Acceleration - Kindergarten to First Grade

A learner enrolled in kindergarten may be admitted to the first grade at the discretion of the School Director or designee and with the consent of the parent/guardian, upon determination by the SST that the child is ready for first grade.

This acceleration determination shall be subject to the following minimum criteria:

- 1. The learner is at least five years of age.
- 2. The learner has attended a public school kindergarten for a long enough time to enable school personnel to evaluate their ability.

- 3. The learner is in the upper five percent of their age group in terms of general cognitive ability.
- 4. The physical development and social maturity of the learner are consistent with their advanced cognitive ability.
- 5. A grade level adjustment document, signed by the team, shall be placed in the learner's cumulative file.

#### Acceleration Guidelines - Grades 1-12

The following guidelines for acceleration shall be implemented:

- 1. When a facilitator or parent/guardian feels a learner should be considered for acceleration, they shall review all available data and then discuss the case fully with the SST. If the learner has more than one regular classroom facilitator, the School Director or designee shall specify the facilitator(s) responsible for discussing the case with the SST.
- 2. The SST may consider the learner's grades, facilitator observations, assessment results, performance-based assessments, participation in available supplemental instruction programs, and any other relevant data or information available to the SST.
- 3. The learner should be performing several grades above their current grade level according to work produced and standardized test scores.
- 4. The SST's decision to accelerate a learner shall be based on what action best serves the child and shall include relevant social and emotional concerns.
- 5. The parent/guardian shall be involved in any decision regarding acceleration of a learner.
- 6. A grade level adjustment document, signed by the team, shall be placed in the learner's cumulative file.

#### Retention

The Governing Board recognizes that very few children benefit from being retained. When any learner is retained or recommended for retention, the School Director or designee shall offer programs of direct, systematic, and intensive supplemental instruction and social emotional support through Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS). Learners shall be identified on the basis of academic achievement, social and emotional maturity, and the number of credits earned during the school year in accordance with law, Board Policy, and the following criteria. \*\*Consideration of retention for learners with an IEP will be discussed at an IEP meeting before a

decision is made by the School Director or designee. \*\*

### Continuation in Kindergarten

Learners who have completed one year of kindergarten shall be admitted to first grade unless the parent/guardian and the School Director or designee agree that the learner shall continue in kindergarten for not more than one additional school year. Whenever a learner continues in kindergarten for an additional year, the School Director or designee shall secure a kinder continuance form, signed by the parent/guardian, stating that the

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learner shall continue in kindergarten for not more than one additional school year. The kinder continuance form shall be placed in the learner's cumulative file.

#### Retention Guidelines - Grades 1-8

The following guidelines for retention shall be implemented:

- 1. When a facilitator or parent/guardian feels a learner should be considered for retention, they shall review all available data and then discuss the case fully with the Student Study Team (SST). If the learner has more than one regular classroom facilitator, the School Director or designee shall specify the facilitator(s) responsible for discussing the case with the SST.
- 2. The SST may consider the learner's grades, facilitator observations, assessment results, performance-based assessments, participation in available supplemental instruction programs, and any other relevant data or information available to the SST.
- 3. The SST's decision to retain shall be based on what action best serves the child and shall include relevant social and emotional concerns.
- 4. The parent/guardian shall be involved in any decision regarding retention of a learner.
- 5. A grade level adjustment document, signed by the team shall be placed in the learner's cumulative file.
- 6. A comprehensive supplemental intervention program, including monitoring for the following year, shall be developed for any learner that is retained.

## Retention Guidelines - High School

Learners in grades 9-12 are not retained into lower grades but must meet graduation course and credit requirements based on school, State, and board policy for graduation from high school.
